Message from Mrs Ezzard

The Connaught teachers came to visit the class this week and it was a really positive time. We know that there will be a mixture of nerves and excitement as the children think of 'next year' and we will be talking things through in class over the coming weeks. Last night, Miss Leggett, Ms Torley (Co-Chair of Governors) and I hosted our Induction Evening for our new families joining in September and it was lovely to be able to welcome them all to our community.

There have been a few cases of tick bites amongst our pupils and this is surprising, given that the children play on astro turf, as opposed to grass. Given the weather, the children have been well covered when going into the copse for Forest School, so I would not have expected for children to have been bitten at school. Please see the information below about what to check for, as they can be on vegetation anywhere and this is out of our control.

Please check that all uniform still fits and is still named during the holidays. Please remember that earrings are NOT allowed to be worn in school; should you choose to have your child's ears pierced, please ensure this is done at the start of the summer break as it is required that earrings are removed before coming to school.

Camo Day is when we learn about camouflage, learn about concealment and hide in the copse-a fun day of outdoor learning. For the last couple of years, we have arranged for a military vehicle to be on site for the children to look at on Camo Day, and this will happen again this year. Our contact has established the Iron Curtain Museum in nearby Normandy, Hampshire: see details below.

We are so proud of how hard everyone has worked this half-term, and the progress the children have made. Thanks for your ongoing enthusiasm and positivity. Happy half-term holiday; have fun, be good, stay safe!

Sun Cream

Now that the weather is sunnier, please apply sun cream to your child before school and ensure that they have a sun hat/cap.

Tick bites

Ticks are small, spider-like creatures which feed on the blood of birds and mammals, including humans. They vary in size, usually between 1mm to 1cm long. They have either 6 or 8 legs.

Tick bites aren't usually painful and sometimes only cause a red lump to develop where you were bitten. However, in some cases they may cause:

swelling

itchiness

blistering

bruising

When going into woodlands, it is always advisable to wear long sleeves and trousers, to prevent ticks from biting arms and legs. With our weather remaining mostly cold and wet, the children have continued to wear full waterproofs during Forest School, meaning that they have been protected. As the weather improves, we would encourage you to ensure that they still have clothing with long sleeves and full trousers for Forest School.

If you've been bitten by a tick, you should try to remove it as soon as possible to reduce the risk of getting a tick-borne infection, like <u>Lyme disease</u>. This is a bacterial infection that causes a pink or red circular rash to develop around the area of the bite.
