

The children have been brilliant at re-telling stories like The Three Billy Goats Gruff and The Three Little Pigs; we've focused on talking through the story with a story map, before writing.

In Art, our first unit was Drawing-we experimented with different mark-making techniques before we drew a still-life picture of fruit and vegetables.

We have just begun our unit about colour mixing and we enjoyed experimenting with the primary colours yellow, red and blue to make the secondary colours orange, purple and green.

This week, the children were concluding our work on story-telling in music, working as a group to decide how to provide a soundscape to match the storyboard of 'Jack and The Beanstalk.' Our focus was **tempo** (fast and slow) and **dynamics** (playing quietly or loudly).




