Playball club

Starting after the May half-term, we are trialling a new club called Playball which we play to run on Mondays after school. Initially this will just be open to Year 1, with a view to opening up to other years from September should the trial be successful. A separate PMX will be sent to Squirrels today regarding Playball.

Tick bites

Ticks are small, spider-like creatures which feed on the blood of birds and mammals, including humans. They vary in size, usually between 1mm to 1cm long. They have either 6 or 8 legs.

Tick bites aren't usually painful and sometimes only cause a red lump to develop where you were bitten. However, in some cases they may cause:

- swelling
- itchiness
- blistering
- bruising

When going into woodlands, it is always advisable to wear long sleeves and trousers, to prevent ticks from biting arms and legs. With our weather remaining mostly cold and wet, the children have continued to wear full waterproofs during Forest School, meaning that they have been protected. As the weather improves, we would encourage you to ensure that they still have clothing with long sleeves and full trousers for Forest School.

If you've been bitten by a tick, you should try to remove it as soon as possible to reduce the risk of getting a tick-borne infection, like <u>Lyme disease</u>. This is a bacterial infection that causes a pink or red circular rash to develop around the area of the bite.
